Council Meeting Minutes
June 25, 2014

City of Goodhue held its monthly meeting on June 25, 2014 at City Hall in Goodhue, Minnesota. All members of the City Council were present. Also present were Richard Gorman, Steve Voth, Barb Stusse, Marie McNamara, Andy Brandel, R.D. Aaland, Trevor Stenlund, and Wayne Hahn.

1. The Mayor, Kerry Bien, lead the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. A Motion was made by Fritz Schulz, seconded by Tia Schimek to approve the agenda.
3. A Motion was made by John Adams, seconded by Leia Ryan to approve the June 11 meeting minutes.
4. Under old business, Richard Gorman gave an update on the Verizon payment. He indicated that they had already sent a check for legal fees and they should send a check for the balance of the construction costs within 30 days.
5. Richard Gorman also gave an update on the Solar Project and also answered any questions that the Council had.
6. There was a discussion about Building Permits and about how long they last. The Mayor explained that they are only good for one year after the date of issuance.
7. The Pool Board gave an update on the progress and it seems there has been a lot of activity. There is going to be an Open House on July 27, 2014 to kick off the Pool Project.
8. Engineer Andy Brandel gave an update on the swimming pool, 3rd Street and the Sewer Plant Project. They all seem to be working well. There was an issue about keeping 3rd Street open and the Engineer was going to handle all of that.
9. There was a Motion by Fritz Schulz, seconded by Leia Ryan to approve the Lion's Raffel application and liquor license.
10. The Council was reminded of Tax Abatement Hearing on July 9, 2014 at 5:30 p.m.
11. The Mayor indicated that he would like to have the City property on the west side of town cut and bailed. He was authorized to take care of this.
12. There was a motion by Fritz Schulz, seconded by Tia Schimek to pay the bills.
13. There was a motion by Leia Ryan, seconded by Tia Schimek to adjourn the meeting at 7:05 p.m.
